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Vice Chancellor's End of Year 2025 Message: Why you should choose Lira University?

I bring you the warmest of the season's greetings from the Lira University family, including the Council, Senate, and the entire Community. Specifically, I extend my warm wishes to our partners and other key stakeholders, who form an integral part of our connected university community.

This time of the year is an opportunity for reflection. As Lira University, we have come a long way because of the tremendous support of people like you, our industrious students, dedicated staff, and other members of our community. At this moment, we have every cause to celebrate our collective accomplishments.

The NRM Government, under the visionary leadership of H.E. President Yoweri Museveni, has established Lira University, a Public University and a Teaching Hospital that is set to become the second specialist hospital in Uganda. We further appreciate the President's vision in setting in motion a fast-growing economy that has catapulted Uganda to a Middle-Income Status.

By ensuring the return of peace, particularly in Northern Uganda, the Government has created conditions for the very serious development that is seen all over Uganda, including Lango. Lira University is home to students from all over Uganda and beyond.

Lira University Main Campus is located on 621 acres of land in Lira City, West Division, northern Uganda. The University also has a 344-acre land campus in Amolatar district, the Faculty of Agriculture and Marine Sciences, with its Master Plan already developed.

The University is now fully established with about 2437 (1502 Male, 61.6% and 935, 38.4% female) students. This is in line with the government policy of "achieving equitable expansion of higher education to all Ugandans".

On support and leadership, we are grateful for the continued support of the University Chancellor, Justice Dr Benjamin Josses Odoki, to the university, as well as his leadership in guiding our strategic plan and re-strategising for the future.

The 7th Graduation Statistics

On 21st November 2025, a total of 456 students graduated; 256 Male, 56.6% and 198 females, at 43.4 % from Six Faculties, which are Medicine, Public Health, Nursing & Midwifery, Education, Computing and Information Sciences and Management Sciences. The students offering MBChB (Medicine and Surgery) are now in their 3rd year and will complete in the next two years. Students who completed postgraduate studies in Midwifery, Public Health, Management Sciences and Nursing also graduated.

The University Governance

Lira University is governed as stipulated in the Universities and Other Institutions Act, Cap 262, of the Laws of Uganda (UOTIA) by three major organs:

The University Council, which is the supreme organ of the University and is responsible for the overall administration and ensuring the due implementation of the objects and functions of the University. The current 3rd Council is Chaired by Mr. David Geoffrey Opiokello and deputised by Ms. Nellie Florence Okullo.

Partnerships and Collaborations

Lira University was started in partnership with SEED Global Health, which provided the first lot of Lecturers in Nursing and Midwifery.

The University also works with other partners, including Vice Chancellors Forum, Consortium of Uganda University Libraries (CUUL), Research in Education Network (RENU), Erasmus/AHEAD-European Union, Public Universities in Uganda, Makerere University Business School, Bournemouth University, Pool Charity Hospital, University of Odisee Belgium, Rotterdam University, Ministry of ICT, Ministry of Science, Technology and Innovation and Ministry of Public Service etc.

The institution has a strong partnership with the local community that is providing accommodation to our students and staff, being typically a non-residential entity. There are 51 gazetted hostels around the Campus. Seven of them are provided with wireless internet by the University with support from the Research Education Network, Uganda (RENU).

Yes, as a young University experiencing a steadfast development, we are undertaking strategic approaches to resource management, curriculum development, and stakeholder engagement in delivering quality higher education during the current challenging economic environment.

The University Team emphasises producing well-rounded graduates equipped with academic, moral, and entrepreneurial skills for societal impact, highlighting the importance of integrity, innovation, continuous learning, and service to community and nation.

On resource optimisation, Lira University considers efficiently managing financial, human, and infrastructural resources as being vital. This includes exploring alternative funding models (winning grants from partners), optimising staffing (filling critical positions in the structure to handle the most urgent and needed activities), and leveraging technology to enhance learning experiences. For example, procuring more computers and IT equipment at all faculties and departments.
